Federal control of grasslands Wildlife in High Country Last cattle drive 1964 - now all by truck Changing market conditions from local to national Cattle russeling Lifestyle upper ranges Bears and cayotes Bigfoot considered Snowblind for 4 days

Old timers had little desire to leave area for San Francisco or outside county Reaction to WW I.
